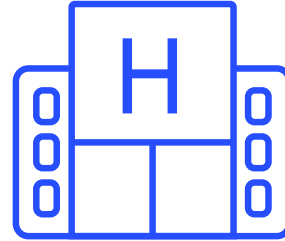

COVID-19 response

“Vall d'Hebron has worked hard to be named a COVID centre, re-formulating all the spaces and preparing the professionals to get ahead of the virus”, says Dr Bruce Aylward, Assistant Director-General, Office of the Director-General of the World Health Organization (WHO)

During the pandemic, the hospital has reconverted spaces, multiplying available ICU bed capacity by almost seven.

Leaders in transplants

We are the Catalan hospital that performed the most transplants in 2019; with a total of **333 transplants** (43 of them paediatric) and the top centre in Spain for lung transplants.

Surgical Block

19 operating theatres featuring architectural and technological innovations that have increased the number of highly complex surgeries performed.

Smart ICU

A smart ICU, with the most advanced technology and connected to the Smart Display, a program that integrates clinical and safety data, transforming it into information that facilitates decision-making.



Leaders in paediatrics

We have been recognised as a children's hospital of excellence internationally, and are a leading player in Catalonia. We treat **all medical specialties**, from basic care to third-degree specialties.

We offer extensive experience and knowledge to help care for children and their families, with a holistic approach to the patient.

Neurosciences

We are pioneers in the field of neuroscience.

We have **expert professionals** who treat our patients in multidisciplinary teams and approximately **100 researchers** across 13 working groups.





Leaders in clinical trials

We are currently working on **1,300 clinical trials**, 399 specifically focussed on oncology.

Other pathologies such as depressive disorder, tuberculosis, non-alcoholic steatohepatitis and neurofibromatosis are part of a European project co-led by Vall d'Hebron that brings together the public and private sectors to lay the foundations of the **adaptive clinical trial platforms of the future**.
